## Board elections in 2025

The European *Drosophila* Board aims to represent the full diversity of the European *Drosophila* research community, while maintaining a board size that is sufficiently small that in-depth discussions do not become unwieldy (see <u>Representation rules</u>). Elections will be held this year to renew half of the board.

#### **Election timeline:**

- March: solicit nominations for openings
- June-July: electronic election
- September: newly elected members announced at EDRC Alicante

Look out for the call for nominations by email and from <u>@fly-eds.bsky.social</u> in March! Encourage your students and post-docs to register.

We are also pleased to announce that **in September 2025 Marco Milán (IRB Barcelona) will take over from Bruno** Lemaitre as president of the EDS. Mirka Uhlirova (CECAD Köln) will replace Marco as vice president.

### EDS best PhD thesis prize

To stimulate, acknowledge, and reward outstanding work performed by PhD students in life sciences using the Drosophila model, the European Drosophila Society is launching a new prize. **This prize will be awarded every two years, endowed with €1000 and a keynote presentation at the European Drosophila Research Conference (EDRC)**. PhD students working in countries represented within the European Drosophila Board that have obtained their PhD diploma between January 1st, 2023, and December 31st, 2024, are welcome to apply. The Vienna *Drosophila* Resource Center (<u>VDRC</u>), host to important and unique fly stocks such as the genome-wide Vienna <u>RNAi</u> collection and <u>other resources</u>, is launching an initiative to expand its valuable collections and help ensure long-term sustainability.

To boost its attractiveness for the European *Drosophila* community **we invite you to deposit your most popular stocks**, especially comprehensive sets of lines for studying specific pathways or mechanisms. The aim is to increase the number of lines that have broad appeal or high value for current and/or future research. Your participation will strengthen this vital European resource while ensuring your lines are professionally maintained and readily available to the research community.

To facilitate the ordering procedure, the VDRC will soon be introducing alternative payment options in addition to credit cards.
